

About Our School

Railway Street Nursery School is a listed building which opened its doors to children over 75 years ago. Over this time, it has become a well established, single unit Nursery School in the heart of Armagh and is well renowned for its inclusive practice. In 2007, the nursery school had a complete refurbishment with an extension added to include an office and a staffroom while the kitchen was relocated and modernised. The outdoor play areas were also fully reconstructed.

Following the refurbishment, the school now boasts a large reception area. During teaching time, this becomes a multi-purpose area for small group activities, large group physical activities, snack and dinner area. We are in a very fortunate position to have our

school cook preparing and serving nutritious dinners on the premises.

The classroom is very spacious with its high ceilings and arched roof. It has three patio doors opening onto a covered play area which lends itself to simultaneous indoor and outdoor play all year round.

Adjoining the classroom is a spacious story room which converts easily into a fully equipped sensory room.





School Gardens

The nursery school takes great pride in the development and maintenance of its school gardens and outdoor environment. We hold an annual Saturday Garden Programme for our children, their parents and families in the Spring term. We have achieved the international Green Flag status.



ICT

We have a fully equipped ICT area which includes an interactive white board, mini iPads and laptops where the children can explore and develop their ICT skills.

Admissions

- Children are admitted in accordance with the criteria laid down by the Board of Governors (see Education Authority Website/Pupil & Parent Section).
- In the event of over subscription in Railway Street Nursery School's admission criteria, children to be selected for admission will be identified by applying the following sub-criteria in the stated order as below.
- (i) Children who have named Railway Street Nursery School as first preference.
- (ii) Children whose brothers/sisters/half-brothers/half-sisters previously attended Railway Street Nursery School. (Please state year attended and names of siblings); or first child;
- (iii) Children will be selected for admission on the basis of initial letter of surname (as entered on Birth Certificate) in the order set out below:-

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This order was determined by a randomised selection and is subject to change on a yearly basis.

- Parents of successful applicants will be informed in writing in early May.
- Parents will be notified by letter of the date and time for their initial visit to the Nursery, which will be held during May/June.

Play Experiences

To develop our children's KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, ATTITUDES and VALUES in each of the six curricular areas, the following play experiences are planned and provided:

- **Dramatic Play:** e.g. house play, shop play, hospital play, travel agents, Santa's workshop, play with small world equipment.
- Construction Play: Large and small construction with commercial and junk materials.
- **Physical Play:** Developing large and fine motor control, strength, balancing, movement through climbing, crawling, running, jumping, pedalling, taking safe risks, growing in confidence.
- **Tabletop Activities:** Jigsaws, puzzles, team board games, exploration of new things/objects of interest and learning how to take turns at all these activities.
- Sand and Water Play (and other natural materials): Pouring, filling, floating, moulding, counting, comparing, sharing, measuring, predicting.
- **Creative Play:** Constructing, drawing, painting, modelling, play with malleable materials e.g. clay and dough, cutting, sticking, musical play with instruments, dancing and singing.
- Outdoor Play: The outdoor environment is viewed as an extension of indoors and many activities are continued from the indoors environment to the outside environment
- Books and other activities: Books and posters/ pictures are present in all areas of play. Children engage alone in groups or with an adult with books, CDs, E-books and puppets.

- ICT: Children are given the opportunity to explore ICT in many areas of play e.g. telephones, mobile phones, cash tills, play computers, digital cameras and electrical items during dramatic play. They freely use the interactive whiteboard, computers and iPads.
- **Visits and Visitors:** We have a rich local environment which we make use of throughout the year as part of our planned learning.



Parenting Programmes

Our school has been included in the Education Authority's Extended Schools Programme for a number of years. For the last three years, the school has also participated in the Department of Education programme, "Getting Ready to Learn". Through both programmes, parents benefit through having access to a number of parent evening courses based on the pre-school curriculum and on their partnership between home and school.

For the past number of years, we have built up strong relationships with the children and staff of Drelincourt Primary School through our Extended School's cluster programme. During the year, we visit each other's schools to engage in a range of activities together – this year our focus is on Drama and role play.

We pride ourselves on our close working relationship with parents and the local community, through this beneficial extended schools programme.

Links with Local Schools

We also developed excellent links with local Primary Schools and participate in transition programmes with all our feeder primary schools in the summer term.

Induction

We aim to provide a safe and friendly environment making your child's transition from home to school as easy as possible.

To achieve this successfully our pre-admission visits provides an opportunity for parents and children to visit school. By working together staff and parents can anticipate any aspects of the nursery day the child may find difficult, and can plan together to help the child cope with these.

Every child will start Nursery at the beginning of September and the settling in period will take place over a 4-6 week period. Our settling in period provides an opportunity to get to know your child on a 1:1 basis and therefore helps us meet their individual needs.



Routine of the Nursery Day

9.00am - 10.15am Outdoor Play

10.15am - 11.25am Indoor play

11.25am - 11.30am Tidy Up time is indicated by music

11.30am - 11.50am Story room for story, discussion, songs and rhymes

11.50am - 12.00pm Toileting/Settling to dinner

12.00pm Lunch is served by Teacher and Assistant

12.40pm Children are engaged in outdoor play or group activities

1.15pm - 1.30pm Flexible home time - parents can come into Nursery and

lift their child from play

Uniform

Red Sweatshirt ('Railway Street Logo')

Navy Leggings / Jogging Bottoms

White Polo Shirt

Shoes / Trainers (Velcro if possible)

It would be greatly appreciated if all parents would encourage children to wear their uniform **every day.**

Our uniform is easy for your child to manage leading to greater independence.

COATS, HATS AND GLOVES SHOULD BE SENT FOR OUTDOOR PLAY.

ALL ITEMS OF CLOTHING MUST BE NAMED!



Informal Snack

A break is provided for your child each day consisting of one or more of the following:

Toast
Bread and butter
Pancakes
Fruit (Apples, Bananas, Oranges, grapes)
Yoghurt
Crackers and Cheese
Cereal
Custard

Each child will also have a drink of milk or water.

To help to cover this cost we ask for a contribution of £3.50 per week (payable weekly). This money not only covers the snack but is also used to replenish resources that have been broken during the course of play. The amount is due each week whether your child is present or absent.

As the Nursery classes encourage healthy eating, only healthy options are available within the nursery setting. Do tell us about your child's dietary needs and we will make sure that these are met. We would ask parents to encourage children to eat the healthy option and refrain from bringing sweets, crisps, drinks etc. to the Nursery as these are not permitted.

School Meals

It is the policy in Railway Street Nursery School to provide all our children with a daily home cooked meal. This is a very important part of the day as it:-

- Develops children's social skills
- Develops independence and self-help skills
- Encourages them to try new foods
- Ensures the children are given a freshly cooked nutritionally balanced meal

Unless you are entitled to receive free school meals the Nursery must be paid in full for any meal consumed which is then paid to the Southern Education and Library Board at the end of each calendar month.

Free school meals application can be completed online or printed out from the Education Authority Website.

If any parent is having difficulty with the payment of meals they should speak to the Principal as soon as possible to come to an agreement about the repayment.

If your child has a dietary requirement and these will be catered for.



Nursery Policies

Copies of the pre-school's policies are available to view at the Nursery, please ask Mrs Morrow.

The Nursery's policies help us to make sure that the service provided by the Nursery is of high quality, and that being a member of the Nursery is an enjoyable and beneficial experience for each child and her/his parents.

The staff and Governors work together to adopt the policies which are reviewed annually. This review helps us to make sure that the policies are enabling the Nursery to provide a quality service for its members and the local community.

Special Educational Needs

A part of the Nursery's policy is to make sure that its provision meets the needs of each individual child, we take account of any special needs which a child may have.

The Nursery works to the requirements of The Special Educational Needs Code of Practice.
